ELECTRICIAN HELPER  
Job Code: 10.050, Pay Grade: BC05  
Bargaining Unit 1

Duties Summary:

Performs routine manual and semi-skilled tasks and assists an electrician in the repair, maintenance and installation of electrical systems and equipment; and performs other related duties as assigned.

Distinguishing Characteristics:

This is the entry-level class in the Electrician series. This class differs from that of Electrician I in that the Electrician Helper performs duties which are essentially routine and repetitive, as well as manual and semi-skilled, and assists an electrician in the repair, maintenance and installation of electrical systems and equipment; whereas the Electrician I performs a variety of skilled electrical work independently as a regular and continuing work assignment and may supervise one or more electrician helpers assisting in the work.

Examples of Duties:

Replaces light fixtures, street lights, outlets, switches, breakers and relay controls; checks traffic lights to see that they are operating properly and makes minor replacements if necessary; digs pole holes, assists in setting poles, sends up equipment and tools with a hand line, and occasionally works on poles; assists in installing cable by preparing, tinning, and wiping metals, preparing lugs, nipples, and taps, and assists in installing racks and racking cable; assists in the repairing and rewinding of electrical equipment or performs such work under immediate supervision; assists in the installation of oil circuit breakers, transformers, and similar equipment in electrical distributing stations; performs simple trouble shooting on house lines, installs, maintains and repairs smaller electrical motors generators and related electrical and mechanical equipment; installs, maintains and repairs refrigeration units, hot plates, fans, water heaters and other similar equipment; installs, maintains, and repairs house wiring, lighting, power appliances, overhead circuits and light machinery; may perform tasks in other building trades when not utilized as an Electrician Helper.

Knowledge and Abilities Required:

Knowledge of: Basic principles and practices of the electrical trade, including safety procedures; common tools, equipment and materials used in the electrical trade.

Ability to: Use hand and power tools common to the electrical trade; read and interpret sketches, simple plans, manuals and other materials; understand oral and written instructions; perform heavy lifting, moving and other manual work typical of the class.
