Attachment to State of Hawaii REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION FROM CHAPTER 103D, HRS. From HHSC/HMC/Operating Room for Stryker Orthopedics

Description of goods, services or construction:

Vendor services for orthopedic equipment/instruments for specific orthopedic procedures in the operating room (OR). Equipment/instruments include surgical implants, instruments and other medical products specific for the operating room. A number of equipment/sets are not kept at Hilo Medical Center (HMC) but flown in on an on-call basis for the surgeon. Most of items not billed until surgery is completed.

Explanation describing how procurement by competitive means is either not prescheable or not advantageous to the State:

Dr. Peter Matsuura is the only orthopedic surgeon who is able to perform total joint procedures at HMC. He is specifically trained in the use of the vendor's equipment/instruments. No other vendor able to provide equipment/instruments specific to Dr. Matsuura's surgical technique and training. It is not advantageous and reasonable for the State to require a surgeon to change his method or practice and use of equipment/instruments. He has been using this vendor for a number of years at HMC with good results for his patients. Vendors/instruments equipment is not interchangeable with other companies.

Adhering to HRS Chapter 103D would have dire consequences for the patients at HMC because the Surgeon would not be able to perform certain orthopedic procedures without the equipment/instruments from this vendor. It is not practical to make a surgeon change his technique or practice. Changing vendors would require re-training of the surgeon at the cost to the state and also the re-training of the OR staff to a new vendors equipment.

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
