8. (cont) A service matrix is going to be put into place with other health care providers, locum tenens agencies, individual contracted physicians, and physician group entities. This complex plan to provide coverage and be prepared for the need to exercise various options requires that HHSC have the flexibility to enter into different agreements with different types of vendors on a continuing basis. However, formal competitive processes do not allow for the flexibility to negotiate with various potential vendors for different methods of providing the coverage.

The CAH's have been experiencing crises due to the lack of coverage and one CAH had to temporarily close it's ER as a result. While an emergency action could be carried out on a case by case basis under the procurement code, it is not always possible to wait until there is imminent danger to health and safety before putting in place the contractual relationship; licensing and credentialing requires that actions be taken far in advance, in anticipation of a shortage of needed personnel. In addition, enormous amounts of time are spent by the administration at the time coverage becomes an "emergency". By putting in place a matrix of various contractual arrangements, more options will be available and closure of CAH Emergency Rooms can be avoided.
